Thank you for considering the Midway Fall Festival a part of your 2019 calendar. This will be the 48th anniversary of the Midway Fall Festival and we are expecting another large crowd. The festival typically hosts record crowds (estimated at over 19,000), and we have plans to continue with our forward progress this year.

Booth spaces are available on both sides of the street, around the Bank Lot, on Gratz Street and Dudley. Remember, booth space allocations are heavily weighted in favor of the returning vendors and on a first-come-first-serve basis. All fees have a , deadline of June 30th. A \$50.00 per 10 x 10 space penalty will be assessed for applications received after June 30th. The committee reserves the right to reject any or all applications received after June 30th. If you are a first time vendor (meaning you did not participate in the 2021 festival), you will increase your chances of acceptance by applying early. Another benefit of applying early is the greater your chances are of receiving your prior year's space. To inhibit excessive duplication of similar products and to ensure that only quality hand-crafted items are exhibited at the festival, we will require at least three photographs of your items. Acceptance notices and setup information will be emailed as soon as possible after the June 30th deadline, making it pertinent you provide your correct email address on your application.

Midway is located 12 miles from Lexington and 45 minutes from Louisville, KY. We're conveniently located 1.2 miles from I-64 off Exit 65.
